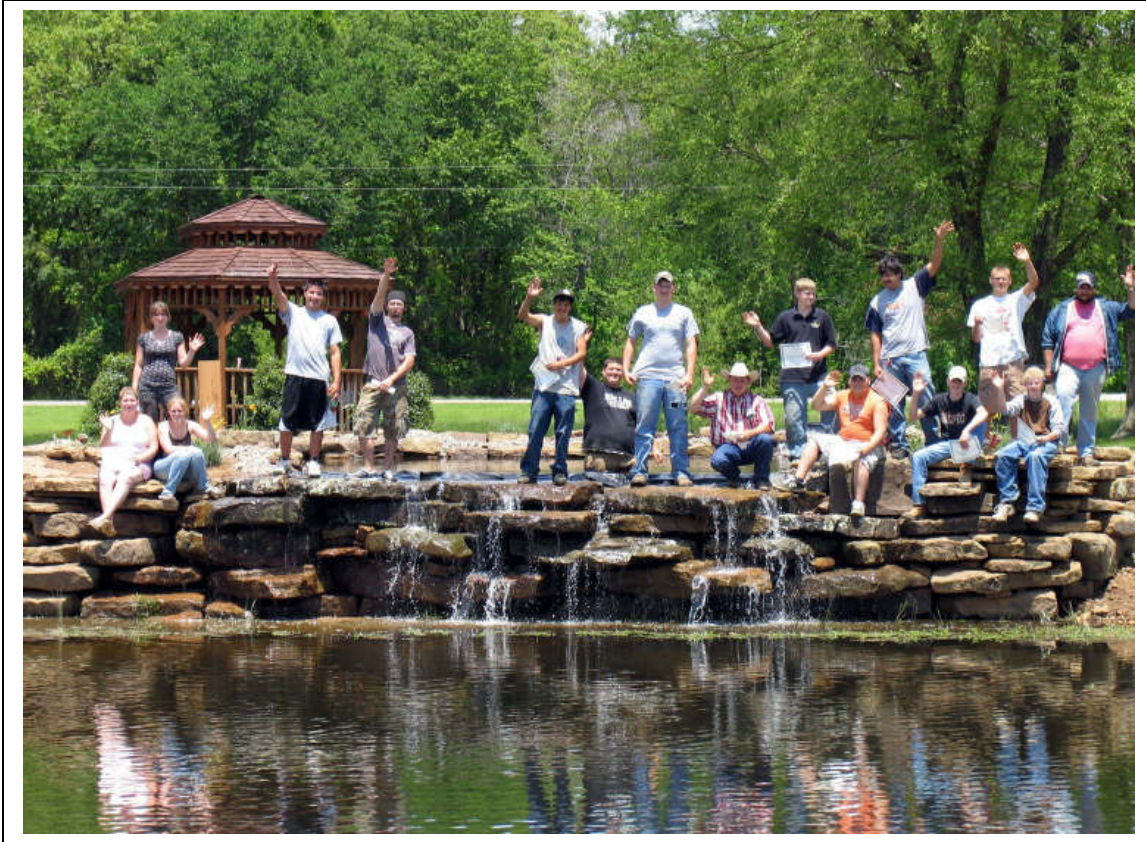


ICTC **Bright Spot** on the Oklahoma horizon
