- ▼ Seven CareerTech occupational program areas serve students in grades 6-12.
- ▼ Programs are located in 559 middle, junior and senior high schools.
- ▼ Enrollment increased to 136,453* in FY04, 12,600 more than two years ago.

- ▼ In FY04, 74,889 middle school through adult students are members of CareerTech student organizations, which help develop teamwork and leadership skills for the workplace and for life.

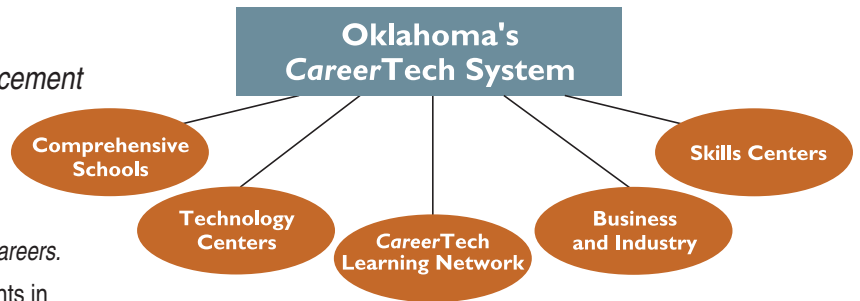
Students in approved cooperative agreement programs at a technology center can receive college credit at a participating higher education institution.

4,299 employers received customized training through the CareerTech system last year.

81,169 Adult and Career Development Enrollments*

CareerTech Skills Centers on 25 Campuses in Oklahoma

Inmates with technical and academic skills are much less likely to return to crime.

Occupational training and related services are provided for soon-to-be-released inmates:

- ▼ Adults behind prison walls
- ▼ Juveniles in detention centers

Skills Centers instructors teach occupational, life and coping skills and place offenders in jobs upon release in areas such as:

- Construction trades
- Auto service technology
- Electrical/mechanical
- Information technology
- Heat, ventilation and air conditioning

Since 1999, 60 percent of program graduates have been placed in training-related jobs.

In 2004, 2,100 inmates participated in Skills Center programs.

In 2004, only 2.7 percent of program graduates have returned to prison.
