CONTEST FEES

In addition to the regular conference registration...there will be a contest supplies fee of \$25.00 per contestant. This charge is to offset the cost of contest supplies. This fee will be added to the contestant's registration when it is completed online.

DATE, TIME, AND LOCATION

Testing – The Professional Development and written exams will be given online March 11th - April 17th, 2013.

Skill Contest – The 2013 State SkillsUSA Automotive Refinishing Technology Contest will be held on Monday, April 22nd and will be hosted at Tulsa Technology Center – Broken Arrow campus.

The contest sign-in will be at 8:00-8:30 a.m., and contest will start promptly at 9:00 a.m.

Contestant Resumes – All contestants will be required to submit a typed resume. If any contestant does not submit a resume to the contest chair, penalty points will be assessed.

TRANSPORTATION

Transportation to and from the contest site **will not** be available. You must make arrangements for transportation.

LUNCH

The contestants will have an hour off for lunch. They may go to lunch with their instructors.

CLOTHING REQUIREMENTS

As in the past, skill contestants will not be penalized for not adhering to national clothing requirements. Contestants should not wear clothing that has school identification visible to the judges. Those contestants wearing program uniforms will need to cover all identifying patches.

AWARDS CEREMONY

Contest winners will be recognized during the Awards Assembly at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, April 23rd in the Arena at the Tulsa Convention Center. Official SkillsUSA attire is required. According to the SkillsUSA Championships Technical Standards- official clothing requirements are as follows: "For men: SkillsUSA official attire: Official red blazer or jacket, black trousers, white dress shirt, plain black tie with no pattern or official SkillsUSA tie, black socks and black shoes. For women: Official red blazer or jacket, black dress slacks or skirt, with businesslike white, collarless blouse or white blouse with small, plain collar that may not extend onto the lapels of the blazer, black sheer or skin-tone hose and black dress shoes. Any contest winner who is not in official SkillsUSA attire will not be permitted on stage. The student will be escorted behind the stage to receive his or her medallion and awards.
